

Each Congregation to Received Funds from the Hottle Grant Distribution

In 2016, the District Conference delegates approved a 4% distribution annually from the Hottle Fund to be available for grants to congregations for projects that impact their community outreach. This year, \$40,000 in grants were distributed!

The delegates also directed that the unused grant money be distributed equally to the congregations (45 churches and 2 fellowships). In December, each congregation in the Northern Ohio District will be receiving a check in the amount of \$858.15 to be used without restriction. These funds represent the balance remaining from the 2017 Hottle Memorial Fund grant distribution.
