



There are no registration or meal costs for children or youth (jr. and sr. high). Advisors serving with the youth through the conference also attend without cost.



Mike Conner Friday Evening Worship




Mike Conner is a bivocational Pastor of the Painesville CoB. He was born and raised in the Akron Springfield COB.

Pre-Conference Workshop Friday, August 8 from 1 pm- 4:30 pm Fruit of Discipleship in Shifting Times

Presenter: Josh Brockway **Location:** East Chippewa Church of the Brethren CEUs for Clergy (0.3 CEUs)

Focus: There is little doubt that the church in North America is experiencing dramatic shifts. Using the parable of the fig tree, we will explore together which it means to be tended and nourished so that we might produce the fruit of God's salvation. Josh will focus on the demographic shifts that are impacting the church and wider society all the same. He will then turn to the practices of the church as regrounding us in the salvation of God.

Presenter: Joshua Brockway has served as the Director for spiritual formation for the Church of the Brethren since 2010. His work includes oversight for the Spiritual Directors Network and the Ethics for Congregations polity. He writes frequently for a range of denominational publications and leads workshops and renewal events on prayer, discipleship, and Brethren identity.

Joshua received his Master of Arts from Bethany Theological Seminary and completed his Masters of Divinity at Candler School of Theology. He finished his PhD in Church History at The Catholic University of America having written on the intersections of prayer, liturgy, and asceticism in the writings of John Cassian.




We are hoping that the ease of an online form will help to increase congregational participation in this process.

Brethren Volunteer Service accepting applications for the 2025-2026 year

Brethren Volunteer Service (BVS) is accepting applications for the 2025-2026 year. "Put your faith in action, and volunteer with BVS!" said an invitation.



Volunteers must be at least age 18 and able to commit to a year of service. Before embarking on a service year, volunteers first attend an orientation. There are two volunteer orientations planned for the year, a summer event in the Rocky Mountains of Colorado and a fall event on the East Coast:

Summer orientation: July 27 to Aug. 4 at Camp Colorado in Sedalia, Colo.

Fall orientation: Sept. 10-18 at Camp Mardela in Denton, Md.

Orientation training is a time spent building community with other volunteers and the BVS staff. At orientation, volunteers prepare for their service experience by exploring ways to enable personal and societal change, learning how to live simply, examining their personal beliefs and values, and becoming more aware of their role as a BVS volunteer.

Volunteers serve with one of BVS' nonprofit partners in the US or abroad. Typically, volunteers go straight to their project site after orientation to begin their year of service. Volunteers are responsible for getting themselves to orientation. BVS provides transportation from orientation to the project sites. During their year of service, volunteers receive housing, food, a stipend, and health insurance. For more information, go to www.brethren.org/bvs.
