The Hottle Grant was established in 2016 to help Northern Ohio District Congregations to expand the ministry of their congregation, impact the community around their congregation and to stimulate growth and spiritual health of their congregation. In the past these grants have been used to improve the aesthetics and needed maintenance of buildings with new roofs, windows and signage. They have also been used to assist in starting outreach programs like food pantries and updating technology within buildings. Requests of up to \$5000.00 can be made. BDM Sends 6 Northern Ohio District CoB Members to Dawson Springs, KY

On Sunday morning, Sept 3, 2023, instead of attending their usual local congregation's worships services that morning, 6 Northern Ohio COB members set out on a journey to Dawson Springs, KY to spend a week serving with Brethren Disaster Ministries. This trip was to help in the rebuilding effort after a tornado ripped through this small town, killing 19 and wiping out 75% of the homes in December 2021.

BDM has partnered with Habitat for Humanity and set up a site in Madisonville KY, about 30 miles from Dawson Springs, where volunteers from around the country come in each week to donate their time and talents in this rebuilding effort. This was second trip this year for NOHCOB, and this time, the team members were Pete and Lisa Snyder (Ashland First), Deb Rising (Ashland First), Jane Matz (Ashland Dickey), Mary Jo Wittel (North Bend) and Dave Bassett (Pleasant View). Once on site, we were joined by four men from Grossnickle CoB, in Maryland.

During the week, the group was divided into two teams (actually three, as Jane and I stayed behind and handled the cooking and housekeeping). The first team of Pete, Deb and Mary Jo were tasked with caulking and painting at different houses. In one day, they and a BDM on-site leader painted the interior of an entire house! The other group, the men from Grossnickle (experienced, retired contractors and past BDM volunteers, along with our own Dave, sheeted the sides, anchored trusses as they were lifted into position, sheeted and shingled the roof, added deadwood to the interior studding and finished their week with a wrap. A house wrap, that is! In addition, some of our volunteers worked on windows and doors in other houses where the building is in progress. It was amazing! Even the project leaders were amazed by the amount of work the teams completed during their week.

Each morning we each made up snack lunches, prayed, and had an amazing breakfast. The teams were given their instructions and set off in the BDM vans to their respective locations. The week started out with temperatures in the 90 degree range, but made a significant drop after mid-week. In the evenings, teams would return to the Habitat warehouse where

Habitat has converted part of the warehouse into sleeping and eating quarters and installed 3 nice showers for BDM groups. Some of us would partake in pre-dinner snacks before cleaning up and resting a bit before dinner. We all dined, fellowshipped together, had devotions, shared a little bit about our day, and received our next-day plan from our leaders. After that, the rest of the evening was up to each individual; some read, some played card games, some just chatted, some worked on puzzles, some went to bed early, some had dishwashing duty. We enjoyed being in each other's company and I especially enjoyed devotions each night, as we took turns! For me, it's always interesting to see what is on each person's heart and what God is saying to each of us. As this group was "more senior" Christians, the devotions seemed to have a lot of wisdom behind them. On a personal note, I had first volunteered to be the housekeeping assistant (each group is to take one), but the BDM cook asked to head up the cooking. I love to cook, but have no "formal" training. Armed with some favorite church and family recipes, and of course, Pete's requests, I think I did ok as dinner was usually quiet and plates were clean! Jane served as my sous-chef, and she makes a mean sausage gravy! I would definitely do this again, in either the cooking role, or another role...and would recommend it! It's a good way to serve a mission trip within our country. There is no financial cost to serve, just your time. The Northern Ohio District has a fund set aside to cover costs of transportation to and from the site.

Don't think that you have no talent to share, BDM project leaders will find a job for anyone who wants to serve. The site in Dawson Springs is a bit unique in that it is new builds and not repair of damaged homes. It is also housed in the Habitat warehouse instead of a church. This project is due

to shut down at end of year but may be continued, TBD. Lisa Snyder


Mike is a bi-vocational pastor, also working full-time as a block truck driver. Mike and his wife, Dawn, have two adult sons.
