Saturday Offering at District Conference For Famine Relief

Even as Nigeria continues to face threats from Boko Haram, there is another growing crisis in Northern Nigeria and that is famine. Most people in the region are subsistence farmers. Many have been driven from their land and have not been able to plant or harvest crops for several seasons. Some have tried to return to their land to wait for planting season. Others have planted only to have Boko Haram come back at harvest time, drive the farmers off and steal the harvest. These factors along with other political and economic issues are bringing famine to Nigeria. UNICEF reports that in Borno state alone, 244,000 children will suffer from severe malnutrition in 2017.
