### **Compelling Vision Conversation**

The Church of the Brethren stands at a crossroads. Recent decades have been defined by paralyzing conflict. Leadership. at both the denominational and district levels, has affirmed calling a team to guide the denomination through a process of conversation and discernment in an effort to arrive at a compelling rooted in our vision shared commitment to live as Christ's disciples. It is an invitation to place our trust in God's Spirit and engage in a visioning process to discern what God is calling us to do together with the fervent hope that our commitment to one another and to serving our God as the body of Christ might be renewed through this shared journey and a sense of shared mission. For as Eugene Peterson says in his paraphrase of Proverbs 29:18: "If people can't see what God is doing, they stumble all over themselves; But when they attend to what (God) reveals, they are most blessed." Ohio District, there are four opportunities to participate in the Compelling Vision Conversations as the Church of the Brethren seeks to discern what God is calling us to do together. Rhonda Pittman-Gingrich, the chair of the Compelling Vision Process Team will provide leadership. The dates/times/ locations are listed to the left. Sessions will start promptly at the times listed. Fellowship and light minutes refreshment begin 30 before the session time. Your presence at one of these sessions is vital as we listen for God's voice and discern Christ's calling.
