
Invitation into the Bible: Connecting Brethren Beliefs with Scripture presented by Jeff Bach

Six Brethren men served prison time at hard labor from 1717 to 1720 for receiving adult baptism. They all prayed for their captors and the fellow prisoners who mistreated them. How did they stay so firm and joyful in their faith? During this illustrated presentation we will ask how seriously we take our faith today, and how meaningful is baptism? The presentation will include reflections on the suffering of Brethren in Nigeria.

- Encourage congregation members to consider mission service opportunities;
- Lead prayer efforts and other engagement opportunities in the congregation;
- When available, host mission workers in the congregation for speaking or other engagement opportunities.

Buckeye Brethren Institute, Introduction to Worship August 28, September 11 and September 25 District Office and Via Zoom Instructor: Terry Vaught

This course will help students guide their congregations in worship. Students will increase their understanding in the theory and practice of worship using the Bible, good spiritual practices and a good understanding of time, space, aesthetics, and planning, to help their community worship God our creator, remember Christ our redeemer, and establish a deeper connection to the Father through the Holy Spirit. Although focusing on Brethren worship, we will take time to appreciate other worship settings to gain a better understanding of how worship has served Christians over the millennia to deepen our relationship with God. Continuing Education Opportunities

The Brethren Academy for Ministerial Leadership is offering: Interim/Transitional Ministry: More than Mere Maintenance, from September 15-November 9, 2021. Tara Hornbacker will be the instructor and TRIM students will receive one credit in Ministry Skills upon completion and the BTS experience. EFSM students may create a Learning Unit for the course. This course will explore the necessary tasks for successful interim/transitional ministry and the personality characteristics most helpful to develop for the practice of this specialized area of congregational leadership. The deadline to register for this course is August 11.

Introduction to the New Testament, October 13 - December 7, 2021. Matt Boersma will be the instructor for this course. Attached is the brochure with more information. This course will look at the various books of the New Testament, explore the world which created these texts, and look at how the texts may have interacted both with each other and the Hebrew Scriptures. The students will look at what the ancient authors of the texts might have been trying to say to their audiences as well as what they are still saying today. The deadline to register is September 7.

The Shape of Ministry in a High-Tech World
October 13, 22-24 and November 3, 2021 via Zoom.
From the barrage of social media platforms to website presence, to electronic communications, to a 24/7 cultural expectation of availability, the role of a

ministerial leader has shifted. In this digital age, how can one ensure that the practice of ministry remains grounded in the core principles of pastoral care and discipleship? How does the ministerial leader avoid substituting high touch ministry with high tech gadgets? What is the role of the ministerial leader in reminding communities of faith about healthy boundaries in the building of a community that furthers the life of discipleship through electronic platforms and social media? How does the ministerial leader maintain healthy Sabbath practices in a 24/7 connected world? This seminar-style course will explore the relationship of ministry to technology and investigates the practical tools that exist to enhance ministry. The class participants will examine the responsible engagement of these digital tools in the work of serving God's people as ministers of the Gospel.
