National Youth Conference 2022 Information

National Youth Conference 2022 (NYC 2022) will focus on Colossians 2: 5-7 (NRSV) and the theme "Foundational." The event will be held July 23 -28, 2022; the registration fee, which includes food, lodging, and programming, will be \$550. Youth who have completed ninth grade through one year of college at the time of NYC (or are age equivalent) and their advisors will gather at Colorado State University in Fort Collins, Colorado. Online registration will begin in early January. The 2021-2022 National Youth Cabinet met virtually in the winter of 2021 to select the theme. The Cabinet discussed theme ideas relevant to senior high youth, ultimately selecting "Foundational." The theme scripture from Colossians 2: 5-7 reads, "For though I am absent in body, yet I am with you in spirit, and I rejoice to see your morale and the firmness of your faith in Christ. As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving."

"Throughout the Bible, God is revealed as a foundation for our lives in many ways. Some examples of this are the cornerstone, the way God can be seen as an anchor for our lives, and how we remain rooted in God in all circumstances," wrote Erika Clary, 2022 NYC Coordinator. Members of the National Youth Cabinet include Ben Tatum (Virlina), Bella Torres (Atlantic Northeast), Elise Gage (Mid-Atlantic), Geo Romero (Illinois/Wisconsin), Hayley Daubert (Shenandoah), and Luke Schweitzer (Southern Ohio/ Kentucky). Advisors to the cabinet include Kayla Alphonse (Atlantic Southeast) and Jason Haldeman (Atlantic Northeast). The Cabinet is led by Erika Clary and accompanied by Becky Ullom Naugle, Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries. The **Church of the Brethren is looking to fill the position of Program Manager**. This position will work with an Advisory Committee to implement the "Part-Time Pastor; Full-Time Church" program, a Lilly Endowment, Inc.-funded initiative that addresses the practical needs of multi-vocational ministers in the Church of the Brethren. This program will include recruiting and training qualified individuals to serve as Circuit Riders, those who assess ministers' immediate concerns, as well as Resource Persons, those who provide expertise regarding concerns identified as most common for multi -vocational clergy. Peer groups are also formed to support pastors beyond their program participation. The Program Manager will manage requests for services, schedule service providers (Circuit Riders and Resource Persons) and meet ongoing administrative needs including completion of required reports to the grant provider.

QUALIFICATIONS: Successful Completion of a Ministry Training Program; Knowledge of the Church of the Brethren structure, polity, practices and culture; Affinity with the values and mission of the Church of the Brethren; A collaborative working style; Strong oral and written communication skills; Use of active listening and discernment skills; Able to relate with integrity and respect within and beyond the organization; Excellent computer skills and familiarity with educational technology; Experience with budgets and financial record-keeping; A resourceful nature; Fluency in Spanish and Kreyol welcome.
