# **Business Items from Annual Conference**

Here are the New Business items that were presented to the delegates at Annual Conference in Greensboro along with their actions:

New Business Items

1. Query: Same Sex Weddings The 2016 Annual Conference adopted a motion from the floor to refer the concerns of the query to the Leadership Team in consultation with the Council of District Executives to bring clarity and guidance concerning the authority of Annual Conference and districts regarding the accountability of ministers, congregations, and districts, bringing recommendations to the 2017 Annual Conference.

This item took the bulk of the discussion time. Standing Committee brought the recommendation that "the consequence for officiating or providing leadership at a same sex wedding is the termination of the ministry credential of the one officiating or providing leadership at a same sex wedding. This shall be for a period of one year, pending review by the district ministerial leadership team. Standing Committee has determined that this item requires a 2/3 majority vote as a controversial issue. If this recommendation is approved, the proposed new polity would become an item of new business at the 2017 Annual Conference and would require a 2/3 majority vote to be adopted as a change in polity as of the 2017 Conference. "

While the recommendation received a majority vote, it was not the 2/3 required for this change in polity to be adopted. So the delegates referred the query as stated above.

Kris Hawk, our Interim District Executive, represents our District on the Council of District Executives (CODE). The next full meeting of CODE is scheduled for January. Some preliminary conversations have already begun.

- 2. Query: On Earth Peace Reportability/Accountability to Annual Conference and Query: Viability of On Earth Peace as an Agency of the Church of the Brethren Recognizing that the Review and Evaluation Committee has the responsibility to consider the balance and unity of denominational agencies, the 2016 Annual Conference adopted Standing Committee's recommendation to refer the "Query: On Earth Peace Reportability/Accountability to Annual Conference" and the "Query: Viability of On Earth Peace as an Agency of the Church of the Brethren" to the Review and Evaluation Committee for their consideration.
- 3. Query: Continuing the Study of Our Christian Responsibility to Care for God's Creation The 2016 Annual Conference adopted Standing Committee's recommendation that a Creation Care study committee be appointed to work, in consultation with Brethren Benefit Trust and other relevant organizations, to develop ways to support and extend our knowledge of renewable energy production with our financial investments and involvement in community projects to reduce our contributions to greenhouse gas concentrations and reduce our dependence on fossil fuels.
- 4. Query: Living Together as Christ Calls The 2016 Annual Conference adopted Standing Committee's recommendation that the concern of the query be adopted and be referred to the Mission and Ministry Board.
