Pray for all who have suffered during this conflict – especially those who have lost loved ones or been injured. Do not forget those who have been left homeless, had work places destroyed, or been left without basic utilities (power, water & sanitation services). Perhaps one of the most enduring tragedies coming out of these events is that many communities in Israel, where Arabs and Jews have lived side-by-side as friends, have been torn apart. Pray that all parties will seek to find a workable resolution to the issues involved and not turn to violence as an option in the future. (Churches for Middle East Peace and more than 50 other church leaders have called for the underlying issues in the conflict to be addressed including occupation, land dispossession, displacement, and the withholding of basic human rights we take for granted.)

Pray for **Ekklesiyar Yan'uwa a Nigeria** (EYN, the Church of the Brethren in Nigeria). The threat of violence in Nigeria continues. The EYN is mourning the death of one of its young pastors, Rev. Bulus Zamdai, who was killed by unknown gunmen at his residence in Gombi. Continue to pray for those who have been abducted and are still missing, and those who have lost their homes.
