- India dealing with an outbreak of a "mystery fever". Authorities have now discovered that the mysterious fever is a combination of dengue fever and scrub typhus. Dengue is a mosquito born virus & scrub typhus in a mite born bacteria. The combination has now killed more than 100 people. More than half of the dead are children. There is also fear of a deadly Nipah virus outbreak. Spread to people from animals, often bats, there has been one case – the death of a 12-year-old boy.
- Spain where extremely heavy rain lead to heavy flooding. There were no direct deaths, but property damage has been devastating & widespread. The flood waters swiped away everything in its path. Some cars were swiped into the sea.
- The people of Afghanistan especially the women & girls as they face life under extreme Islamic fundamentalism & the continuing terrors of violence.
- Afghan refugees as they seek new homes. Children's Disaster Services has been asked to work with Save the Children to provide child care for children at several airports where refugees are arriving in the U.S. & at some facilities where they are being taken.
- Haiti people still recovering from the earthquake & tropical storm in August. Brethren Disaster Ministries (BDM) is working with the Haitian Church to help people affected. The storm struck an area hit be Hurricane Matthew in 2016. BDM helped in the area in 2016 too. The new church started at that time has lost their building, 90% of the homes in the area have been destroyed, people are injured; some are still missing.
- Fires in western states. Fires continue to burn in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana, California, Wyoming, & Minnesota.
- The number of COVID cases continues to climb in the U.S. & elsewhere. Especially remember children too young to be vaccinated particularly those more vulnerable back in school. Experts fear 80% of children may get COVID because they are not protected. Outbreaks are closing some schools in Ohio & elsewhere. Remember people with no access to medical care or vaccines.
