## **Prayers Needed**

- Victims of Gun Violence 29,662 people have died in gun violence this year, including 1,124 children. 26,464 people have been injured including 3,023 children.
- Migrants & Refugees especially those who are exploited by smugglers.

Remember those facing excessive heat and other weather challenges. Remember those who are returned to their countries where they continue to face abuse & death.

- All those dealing with natural disasters. Among them: excessive heat in much of the world. As well as drought, fires, flooding, earthquakes, storms. A third of Pakistan is under water from flooding. They are also dealing with extreme poverty and hunger.
- Countries Dealing with Major Political and/or Economic Upheaval including Sri Lanka, Venezuela, the Philippines, South Africa, Nigeria, South Sudan, Myanmar, Democratic Republic of Congo, Columbia, Syria, Afghanistan...
- Afghanistan where women and girls have lost their rights & children are starving.
- Women & Girls who are treated as second class citizens in many countries.
- Ukraine where the war continues as does hunger, the risk of epidemic disease, & the risk of nuclear disaster.
- The continuing COVID Pandemic. Case numbers were up again last week. A new vaccine booster covering current strains, will be out around Labor Day. Long COVID is a continuing problem. Remember those who are studying the virus to understand its impact of people over the long term. Its impact on the brain is a particular concern.

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When we pray for the people in need in our world, we are praying for peace. Peace is not just the absence of war, it is Shalom – living in harmony with each other & with God's creation. Shalom means health, safety, tranquility, wholeness, & rest – the welfare & prosperity of all. Praying for the needs of others is an important first step in loving people as God calls us to. Next steps include using our time, talents, & resources to help others when disaster strikes, offering comfort in times of need, & working for change when the suffering of others comes from discrimination, persecution, exploitation, or abuse. When shalom does not exist for everyone, no one is fully at peace!



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
