Putin is now trying to hire soldiers from other countries (especially those who have been trained by U.S. forces in Afghanistan or elsewhere) to fight for Russia. He has resumed shelling key Ukrainian cities including the capital Kyiv. Electricity has been cut to at least half a million homes in Kyiv & many more in other cities by these attacks. Pastor Alex (Brethren pastor in Chernihiv, Ukraine), reports that Chernihiv is among the cities being attacked again after a summer of relative peace for them. There is no power in Chernihiv, & people are cutting wood to prepare for the winter. Pastor Alex plans to stay & minister there as long as he can keep his family safe.
- The People of Haiti —dealing with a cholera outbreak, gang violence, & major
  political unrest. The gang violence has impacted church activities. A Brethren
  Food Initiative driver was kidnapped & his truck stolen. He was latter released.
  Brethren medical programs have been curtailed because some doctors have fled

- Puerto Rico & Dominican Republic, & the Philippines still recovering from hurricanes & storms.
