- People still recovering from storms & flooding in the U.S. & elsewhere. Remember people who live in places where the impact of climate change on the severity of storms & flooding is making their home areas unlivable. More tornados hit the south this week & more tornados are expected.
- Those recovering from earthquakes in Indonesia as of November 25, at least 310 have been killed, & 24 are still missing. At least 2,000 are injured. There have also been quakes in the Solomon Islands & off the Mexican/U.S. Pacific coast.
- Ukraine where the war continues Rocket/missile attacks against Ukrainian cities are ongoing. Vital civilian power facilities & other infrastructure are being targeted. This is affecting millions of civilians. How people will survive winter without power for heat, water, & other utilities is a serious concern. Anti-war protests in Russa & resistance to military conscription is ongoing as is some degree of martial law in all areas under Russian control in Ukraine & Russia.
- The People of Haiti –still dealing with a cholera outbreak, gang violence, & major political unrest.
- **Uganda** give thanks that the Ebola outbreak seems to be under control this week. The number of new cases has finally started to decline.
- The People of Somalia facing a major famine & violence. The worst drought in 40 years, which is related to climate change, & violent conflict combine to put millions in danger of starvation.
- Victims of Gun Violence 40,424 people have died in gun violence in 2022 (up 808 from last week), including 1,537 children (up 32 from last week). 35,783 people have been injured (up 640 from last week) including 4,132 children (up 94 from last week). 21,978 of the deaths are suicides (up 462 from last week). There have been 617 mass shootings in 2022 (12 were last week).
- The continuing COVID Pandemic, & the outbreak of the RSV virus. Also, the CDC has declared that flu is now an epidemic in the U.S. Many pediatric hospitals are out of beds because so many children are sick with RSV, flu, COVID, or a combination of these.
