## This week, remember:

- People in the U.S. recovering from storms & flooding tornados in Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia; Illinois, Iowa, Arkansas, Indiana, Missouri, & Tennessee; high wind damage in Ohio; flooding in California, Arizona, etc.
- Those who are sick, homeless, hungry, abused, alone.
- Recovery continues After Earthquakes in Turkey/Syria, Afghanistan/Pakistan, & Ecuador/Peru
- Congo where there is a cholera outbreak in refugee camps
- Malawi, Mozambique, & Madagascar recovering from cyclone Freddy. Malawi is also dealing with a cholera outbreak.
- Around the world, thousands of people are fleeing their homes due to political crisis & violence As of 2022 there were some 103 million people forcibly displaced (people forced out of their home countries). There were 53.2 million internally displaced people (in 2021).
- Victims of Gun Violence Already this year, 10,939 people have died in gun violence (up 814 from last week) including 444 children (up 29 from last week). 8,347 people have been injured (up by 674 from last week) including 1,062 children (up 93 from last week). 6,270 of the deaths are suicides (up 462 from last week). There have already been 140 mass shootings (up 10 from last week) this year. (Gun Violence Archive statistics). There are, on average, 1.5 mass shootings every day in the U.S. No other developed country has anything like the gun violence seen in the U.S.
- Ukraine where the war, now over a year old, continues.
- The continuing COVID Pandemic COVID continues to be a serious issue. While vaccines & treatments have reduced COVID death rates, COVID continues to spread. (The number of new cases is increasing in some places, including India, while remaining flat in others.)
