"On January 21, 2013, Hadiya Pendleton, a high school student from the south side of Chicago, marched in President Obama's second inaugural parade. One week later, Hadiya was shot and killed on a playground in Chicago. Soon after this tragedy, Hadiya's childhood friends decided to commemorate her life by wearing orange, the color hunters wear in the woods to protect themselves and others. 'Wear Orange' originated on June 2, 2015—what would have been Hadiya's 18th birthday. Now, it is observed nationally on the first Friday in June and the following weekend each year." That means in the time it has taken to type this prayer request, 72 people have been displaced and become refugees. Leaving their homes is their only choice. . .More than 7 in 10 of all refugees under UN mandate & other people in need of international protection come from just 5 countries: Syrian Arab Republic (6.8 million), Venezuela (5.6 million). Ukraine (5.4 million), Afghanistan (2.8 million), & South Sudan (2.4 million). Only 204,500 refugees were able to return home in the first 6 months of 2022. 74% of all refugees & others in need of international help are hosted (given refuge) in low- and middle- income countries. The least developed countries – those with the fewest resources needed to help, provide asylum to 22% of the total number of refugees. (UNHCR statistics)
