- **Refugees** 57% of refugees come from Syria, Afghanistan, or South Sudan. 37,000 people are forced to flee their homes every day due to do conflict or persecution. 41.3 million people are internally displaced, 25.9 million are refugees, and 3.5 million people are seeking asylum.
- Nigeria where people continue living with the threat of violence.
- Emigrants attempting to seek asylum in the U.S. Reports continue to confirm that the treatment of emigrants at the U.S. border is inhumane, cruel and degrading. Pediatricians have expressed renewed concern that the effects of such treatment on the children may have life-long detrimental effects on them.
- The people of the Ukraine and other places living with invasion and war
- Shooting victims
- Those who are homeless
