- Remember our Brothers & Sisters in Nigeria, especially as they morn. On January 2 Lawan Andimi, was abducted by Boko Haram. On January 21st we learned that Boko Haram executed him on January 20. Lawan Andimi was an ordained minister in Ekklesiyar Yan'uwa a Nigeria (EYN, the Church of the Brethren in Nigeria), served as EYN district secretary for the Michika area, and was chair of the Christian Association of Nigeria (CAN) for the Michika area. Boko Haram followed the execution by attacking the village where Pastor Andimi was born. The video statement his captives released, which they intended as a desperate plea for his life, was in fact Pastor Andimi's clear and calm affirmation of his faith in Jesus. It is a powerful witness to the Christian community. While the rest of the world has largely forgotten about the violence this group fosters, the people of Nigeria continue to live with the threat, fear, and loses every day. A Nigerian soldier was killed with Pastor Andimi. In December, 11 Christian captives were beheaded on Christmas Eve. 4 aid workers, trying to alleviate hunger, were also killed in December. More than 2 million people have had to flee their homes, 250,000 people have fled the country, and thousands have been killed since 2013. 6,600 people were killed in 2014 alone. Nigeria is the second most violent country for persecuted Christians. Pakistan is the most violent country for persecuted Christians (2020WorldWatchList).
- Puerto Rico earthquake victims. The island has experienced aftershocks and tremors every day since December 28. Some have been magnitude 5 or higher including the 6.4 magnitude quake January 7th. Puerto Rician Brethren pastors and district leaders continue to identify needs and coordinate response to the disaster. A tent city has been established to provide shelter since buildings are not safe. This and other aid will be needed for weeks or as long as the quakes continue. People are moving to the mountains in the center of the island, away from the south where the damage has been the worst. A tent city has been set up in the town of Castañer in the square were the anniversary of Heifer International was held a few months ago. Castañer, where the Brethren hospital is located, is also where continuing Brethren hurricane relief efforts are based. Hurricane Maria devastated the island in 2017 and people are still suffering.
- Remember the people of the Philippines On January 12th the Taal volcano erupted with a 9-mile-high ash cloud. By the 13th, more than 25,000 people had already fled their homes. By the 18th, more than 70,000 people had fled their homes. Some 450,000 people live within 8.7 miles of the mountain and should be evacuated. There have already been more than 666 earthquakes since the eruption. This could continue for weeks or months...
