
Peace begins when you make your peace with Jesus, accept Him as Savior, and follow Him as Lord.

Reports From Peace Day, September 21st



The International Day of Peace has been observed every year since it was established by the U.N. (United Nations) in 1981. The day has also been a day of Prayer For Peace since 2004 when the World Council of Churches es-

tablished it as such. This year several congregations in the District participated by making or displaying pinwheels for peace as a way of showing their concerns, prayers, and hopes for peace, for an end to gun violence, and for an end to other forms of violence in our communities and the world.

Information on Peace Day went out to congregations starting at Districe Conference. This included information on The Pinwheel Project which is an international project started in 2005 to promote peace in the world, and on "Whirled Peace", an emphesus on preventing gun violence sugested by the Church of the Brethren Gun Violence Prevention Team this year.
