To start the conference weekend Nate Polzin, the Executive Director of Discipleship and Leadership Formation for the Church of the Brethren, led the Pre-Conference Workshop "For My Neighbor's Good" with a focus on a 5 week study on relational evangelism for the Brethren.

The Conference itself officially began with a meal on Friday evening., followed by opening worship. Moderator Tina Hunt introduced the conference theme "Know the Truth, Tells the Stories" with a powerful message from Psalm 78.7. Pam Chase (Sugar Creek West) provided piano accompaniment throughout the weekend,

Saturday business opened with music and a devotion led by the Moderator. Saturday evening worship was lead by Nate Polzin, based on scripture from Romans 12-3-21. We also had special music provided by Rick Harvey.

#### **Business Session**

It was a full day for the delegates during the business session on Saturday. In addition to the business items there were reports from the board, commissions, treasurer, camp and national representatives. The delegates

- 1. Voted on the ballot presented by the Nominating Committee. (The ballot results are on page 2.)
- 2. Approved the 2025 District Budget of \$195,682, an increase of \$449 over the 2024 budget.
- 3. Approved the 2025 Inspiration Hills budget of \$368,675. While still a deficit budget, it is much closer to being balanced than in previous years.
- 4. Approved the motions to finalize the withdrawal from the denomination of the North Bend (Danville) and East Nimishillen congregations.
- 5. The Dupont Query "Questioning the LGBTQ+ proliferation in our society and its non-scriptural support and acceptance by the church" failed after much discussion. 44% voted yes. Of those voting no, most voted

that they would like to see more work done on the query and brought back to the board.


