Upcoming Winter Camp and Project with a Purpose

If you loved summer camp then you will REALLY love winter camp! Roaring fires, snowball fights, snowman tournaments, live worship and more. Join us for Junior High Weekend blowout February 10-12 and Junior Winter Camp February 17-19, 2017. The camps are already filling up fast so don't wait to register! The camp continues to look for ways to reach out to new people and to provide a place for leadership development in our district. With this in mind, the Camp Administration has made the decision to immediately begin the renovation of Walnut Lodge so that it can be used to house Brethren Volunteer Service workers and staff. The building will be equipped with 3 self-sufficient apartments (1 upstairs and 2 downstairs) that can house up to 6 people in each unit.

Walnut Lodge has been stripped down to the studs in preparation of new plumbing, electrical panels, and wiring, insulation, HVAC and fire barriers between units. The blueprints and artist rendering of the final design follow.

We anticipate the final cost of this renovation to be between \$150,000

and \$200,000 and we hope to complete the project in 2017. We are looking for additional gifts from congregations, families and individuals to add to the Capital Improvement funds we have available so that we can bring this project to completion as quickly as possible. 
Ordination Service for Dean Foster

"Query: Same Sex Weddings The 2016 Annual Conference adopted a motion from the floor to refer the concerns of the query to the Leadership Team in consultation with the Council of District Executives to bring clarity and guidance concerning the authority of Annual Conference and districts regarding the accountability of ministers, congregations, and districts, bringing recommendations to the 2017 Annual Conference."

The Council of District Executives (CODE) Executive Committee and leadership team have met on this issue. The full CODE and leadership team are meeting even as we go to press to make decisions on what to bring to Annual Conference in 2017. Updated information will be shared in the February bulletin insert.

The light is more easily seen in the darkness, and so times of fear and change are also times of hope and renewal. "Reenacting" the First Brethren Baptism in America

As you know from Church of the Brethren history, the Brethren began coming Colony to the Pennsylvania in 1719, led by Peter Becker. In 1729, Alexander Mack led another group of Brethren families to America. The first congregation was organized, and the first Baptisms took place in the Wissahickon Creek near Germantown, Pa., on Christmas Day, 1723. The Brethren Meetinghouse at Germantown can be visited still today, as can the cemetery behind it, holding the graves of Alexander Mack and many other Brethren leaders. The Wissahickon Creek also still flows, rising in Montgomery County, PA and running approximately 23 miles through or next to much parkland before emptying into the Schuylkill River at Philadelphia. It makes a wonderful spiritual "pilgrimage" site Brethren.

Stan and Mira Palmer have been attending the Eden Church of the Brethren for the past year or so. Stan grew up and was baptized in the Freeburg Church of the Brethren at Paris, Ohio. Mira grew up in the Minerva area. They recently retired

in the Canton area and began attending Eden. When they decided to become members, though she had previously been baptized, Mira also wanted to be baptized by trine immersion. Her baptism was scheduled for the Sunday before Christmas. However, a bad ice storm hit the night before, and because of the danger produced by the accumulation of ice, the Deacons decided to cancel services that day.



Anticipating a smaller attendance on Christmas Day, and the possibility of inconvenience for family plans, interim pastor Wayne Scott gave Mira the option of rescheduling her baptism for another day. But the Palmers said they planned to be in worship on Christmas, so why not proceed! It then also occurred to the congregation that this was an historic occasion, whereas the first Brethren baptisms also had taken place on Christmas Day, 293 years before! Could God have had something to do with this? After all, there are no coincidences with God!!

Of course, we are pretty sure the ice on the Wissahickon had to be broken before those baptisms could take place - something the Eden Church did not have to do! Though those early Brethren surely remembered their baptisms, especially because of the iciness of the water, we are glad to report Mira always will remember her baptism, too! In fact, Stan said "Mira and I have had 38 Christmases together, and by joining Eden and Mira's baptism today, Christmas 2016 ranks as the very best we have shared!" All praise to God for God's blessing and peace!!

A trailblazer for truth and relationships, Josh McDowell has been at the forefront of cultural trends and ground-breaking ministry for over five decades.


Josh shares the essentials of the Christian faith in everyday language so that youth, families, churches,
