

Ashland First Church of the Brethren

In 2019, Ashland First Church of the Brethren received a Hottle grant of 5,000. This was the second grant awarded to our congregation. In 2018, monies were awarded to be used toward the installation of a new roof. This year, the monies helped us continue the revitalization of our exterior, going toward new windows. Our old windows (from the 1950's) were not energy efficient and were showing much wear. With the gifts we received from members, memorial funds, Peace Lutheran and Trinity Lutheran churches in Ashland, and the Hottle Grant Fund, we were able to start the process by installing 15 new windows in August of 2019 at a total cost of \$24,008. We are now encouraged to continue to raise additional funds to replace remaining windows in the future. Thank you, Northern Ohio District, for your assistance in this ongoing project.

Ordination / Commissioning Renewal Year

In the Church of the Brethren, every five years ministry credentials are reviewed and renewed. This process includes all ordained and commissioned clergy. Clergy are required to complete CEU's, attend Ministerial Ethics Training, and undergo a background check.

As part of this process, each congregation is asked to complete a "Congregational Support Form" to affirm ongoing support for the minister. The form is due by March 30, 2020. It will be sent to each Church Board Chair or you can access it at www.nohcob.org/renewal.

Annual Conference Moderator's Forum Slated for April 18, 2020



Church of the Brethren Annual Conference Moderator Paul Mundey has announced that he will be hosting a Moderator's Forum this spring. The event will take place at the Young

Center for Anabaptist and Pietist Studies at Elizabethtown College, Elizabethtown, PA. The date is April 18, 2020 from 1-9 p.m.

The forum's focus is "Historical Themes Impacting Today's Church." It will feature leading Brethren historians who will address a variety of historical themes impacting present-day congregations, districts, and national structures. Particular attention will be given to Brethren history and themes relevant to the current reality of Brethren communions, with special emphasis on the Church of the Brethren.

Themes to be addressed include accountability, compelling vision, division, forbearance, and nationalism. Historians participating include Jeff Bach, Director, Young Center for Anabaptist and Pietist Studies, Associate Professor, Department of Religious Studies, Elizabethtown College; William Kostlevy, Director, Brethren Historical Library and Archives; Stephen Longenecker, Edwin L. Turner Distinguished Professor of History, Bridgewater College; Carol Scheppard, Professor of the College, Professor of Philosophy and Religion, Bridgewater College; and Dale Stoffer, Emeritus Professor of Historical Theology, Ashland Theological Seminary.

The forum is open to both clergy and laity. Registration cost, which includes dinner, is \$30.00. For those attending the entire event, point six (0.6) CEU's (Continuing Education Units) are also available for an additional cost of \$10.00. This event will also be available via live stream for a registration fee of \$15. To register or secure a forum brochure, please visit: tinyurl.com/modforum2020. The registration deadline is April 9, 2020. Space for the main sessions (other than worship) is limited to 150 participants, thus you are encouraged to register early. Hartville Church of the Brethren sells building, moves forward in ministry

In their January 2020 Council meeting, the Hartville Church of the Brethren voted to sell their church building and property to Hartville Homes Foundation (dba GentleBrook).

GentleBrook is a not-for-profit organization that provides a variety of programs and services for individuals with developmental disabilities, seniors, and community members as a whole in both Stark and Coshocton counties in Ohio. In a new joint ministry with the Hartville Church, GentleBrook will use parts of the church building for these ministries on weekdays as the church expands their weekend services to better reach these individuals and their families.

As part of this unique agreement, the congregation will receive a down payment then monthly payments for 10 years. During those 10 years, they will have a rent-free lease for exclusive use of the sanctuary and offices and ability to use the rest of the building evenings and weekends when GentleBrook is not using the facility. Additionally, most utilities and building repair costs and improvements will be covered by GentleBrook during this time. At the end of the 10 years, they will have the opportunity to renew the lease.

The congregation has already begun to partner with GentleBrook on ministries, and plans are in place to deepen those ministry connections. Many in the congregation believed that an excessive amount of their financial resources went into the upkeep of the building and look forward to being able to invest in ministry to the community in new ways. Several area churches have expressed a desire to join with them in this new ministry. It's the congregation's hope that this unique ministry opportunity will help to spread the Gospel in ways that are often overlooked.

2020 Annual Conference Orchestra


