### Message from the Moderator Brian Layman, Pastor Ashland First CoB

Hebrews 10:24 offers a challenge to the church: "Let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works." It's a challenge that we the Church are meant to meet mutually - together. The word Allelon (Al-lay-lone) is the Greek word that is translated as "one another". Literally, it is another plural word for "YOU", but adds direction and action to its meaning. # Internal Revenue Service Increases Mileage Rate for Remainder of 2022

Beginning on July 1, 2022, the standard mileage rates for the business use of a vehicle will be 62 cents per mile driven. This is up 3.5 cents from the earlier IRS 2022 rate.

# Hygiene Kits for District Conference Service Project

You can make a world of difference by making Hygiene Kits for people in need through Church World Service. When disasters happen anywhere in the world, Health Kits can help people stay clean and healthy and that can save lives. The ability to wash, brush teeth, or cover a cut can make the difference be- tween getting sick and staying well when you are living in the aftermath of a hurricane, tornado, flood or other disaster.

To complete a Kit:

Seal all items in a one-gallon plastic bag with a zipper closure.

Send \$2.00 with each kit to cover processing and shipping. (Do Not put the money in the kit.)

If you prefer:

a donation of \$15.00 will allow Church World Service to provide a Health Kit.

In each Hygiene Kit please Include:

- 1 hand towel (approx. 15 x 28 to 16 x 32 inches)
- 1 washcloth
- 1 wide-tooth comb (at least 6" of teeth)
- 1 finger nail or toe nail clipper (out of packaging)
- 1 bar of soap (bath size in wrapper) 1 toothbrush (in original package) 10 standard size Band-aids

We are not to include toothpaste in kits. It will be added to kits at New Windsor when kits are sent out so the toothpaste is fresh.

# County Line Church of the Brethren

After two summers off of doing a week-long Vacation Bible School (VBS), County Line Church decided to change things up. Instead of doing a week-long VBS in the summer, we hosted Winter Bible School, which ran from Jan-February, once a week on Wednesday evenings.

Although VBS was considered one of our church's biggest outreaches, it was really not ministering to non-church people. Having two years off of VBS (due to the pandemic), we had the perfect platform for introducing a change. Plus, winter is comparatively less busy than the rest of the calendar year, often with families looking for activities to do with their kids. And as an added bonus, moving from one fun-filled week to only once a week, put a lot less pressure on our volunteers.

We held WBS on Wednesday nights from 6-8 pm through January and February, open to kids age 3 through 5th graders inclusively. The program we chose studied the Armor of God from Ephesians, with our key bible verse being Ephesians 6:10 "Be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power." Our program included multiple stations which groups of kids rotated through, including music, crafts, bible story, and reflection time (which were tailored to each age groups' ability), as well as an all-age opening and closing in our sanctuary. We averaged 35 kids per night, with almost 50% of these kids being completely new to our church.



We really wanted the focus to be ministering to the whole family, so we an offered adult bible study class, so parents could stay on-site and learn. while their kids took part in WBS. Teenagers were encouraged to help out or join the adults in bible study. We also offered a family

meal beforehand, to encourage the whole family to come

out and join us. These family feasts were a real success, and a big draw for families with younger children.

The kids and volunteers loved every minute of it! This new WBS program, as a whole, was successful and we're already planning to do it again next winter.
