Message from the Moderator

District Conference 2021— Saturday, August 14th Akron Springfield Church of the Brethren

The 2021 Northern Ohio Church of the Brethren District Conference will be held on Saturday, August 14th at Akron Springfield CoB. Due to Covid19 and the need to plan in advance, the District Central Committee with the favor of the Akron-Springfield Church has decided to make the 2021 Conference with a few essential exceptions, a "Delegates Only" Conference.

However, the full 2021 District Conference will be live-streamed at no cost. The church delegates participating will meet in-person on location at the Akron Springfield CoB. Social distancing and masks will be in place for the day's activities. Each church delegate must register and pay in advance the District Conference Fee of \$40 (which will include all of the cost for meals, materials, special supplies, and speaker fees).

Due to the need of "postponing/canceling" of last Summer's District Conference due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, we have kept for our theme this year's 2021 District Conference the same. Our theme is **"Focusing on Jesus" Vision of His Church and for His Church" based on Matthew 16:18 & 28:18-20.** This theme will still prove to be very timely due to our denomination's current focus on "a compelling vision." The theme will keep us centered on Jesus' biblical & authoritative Vision for His Church

Our District's very-own, retired Minister, **Rev. Tom Zuercher** will be our special keynote speaker in the Afternoon Worship Service. Our 2021 Moderator, **Pastor Brad Kelley** will share in the Opening Worship Service.

Note: Due to the scaling back of the normal District Conference format from a "two day" to a "one day" Conference, there will be no Pre-Conference Workshops offered. Our originally planned Pre-Conference Presenters Tom Zuercher and Jeff Bach have graciously agreed to present their originally planned pre-conference sessions as a Pastor's Workshop. Tom's presentation will be in the Spring and Jeff's will be in the Fall. Both Workshops are CEU opportunities.

Message from Central Committee:

Our 2021 Northern Ohio District Conference will be held as a one-day, delegate only event at the Akron Springfield Church of the Brethren on August 14th. This will allow for social distancing as part of the COVID-19 precautions that will be in place for those that gather. The worship services and business sessions will be live streamed so that non-delegates can participate in this day. More details to follow.

District Conference Business Items

The District Conference business agenda is fairly full this year. In addition to calling leadership through the ballot and approving a 2022 budget, a revised constitution will come before the delegates. This revision does not appreciably differ from the current content, but cleans up the format making it easier to reference. There are also two motions coming related to the Hottle Memorial Fund, the generous gift that has provided assistance to our churches, camp, and district ministries.

Motions regarding Hottle draw

- 1. The District Board recommends that beginning in 2022, the yearly draw from the Hottle Memorial Fund be decreased from 12% to 9% (taken in quarterly installments), distributed as follows: 3% District Operating Expenses, 3% Inspiration Hills Operating Expenses, 3% Church/Fellowship Grants.
- 2. The District Board recommends to the District Conference that the unused funds from the church/fellowship portion of the Hottle Grant distribution remain in the Hottle Memorial Fund at the end of each year.

Kid's Closet is a ministry of Akron Springfield COB that serves the children in grades K-6 in the area's elementary schools. Many of these children are from low socioeconomic households. Pastor Brad will address the first part of this year's 2021 Conference his Theme in message "Focusing on Jesus' Vision of His Church" from Matthew 16:18. The message will focus on Jesus' promise to build His Church and that His Church will prevail and be triumphantly completed in the end!

Pastor Brad currently shepherds the East Chippewa CoB congregation near Orrville, OH. He has been Pastor of East Chip since June of 2011. He is thoroughly thankful and knows he is blessed for being able to pastor at East Chip. Brad celebrated 30 years of pastoral ministry in January of 2020. He and Sharon, his wife of over 34 years, have three grown children and live in the West Salem area.

Brad accepted the call to be our "2020 District Moderator" during the 2018 District Conference. He has been in this type of District role 20 years earlier in his previous pastorate in the Fellowship of Grace Brethren Churches. Recently, he has become one of our teachers in the District's Brethren Buckeye Institute. He taught the Fall 2019 BBI course on "Evangelism." For nearly the last 2 and half decades, He has provided quarterly preaching for the evangelistic chapel services at Akron Ohio's homeless shelter, the Haven of Rest.

Brad received formal higher education training from Grace College (Bachelors with a double major in both Biblical Studies and Speech Communications), Ashland Theological Seminary and Liberty Baptist Theological Seminary (Masters of Divinity and some Doctor of Ministry course work).
