

#### Northern Ohio Ministry Training Program Certified

The Buckeye Brethren Institute (BBI), our Northern Ohio ministry training program, is now fully certified by the Brethren Academy of Ministerial Leadership as an Academy Certified Training System (ACTS). This is training that is recognized throughout our denomination as meeting the educational requirement for ordination. Paul Bozman (Pastor, Akron Eastwood) serves as the program coordinator and was instrumental in completing the application process.

Through BBI, Licensed ministers education can receive the necessary to move towards ordination and those alreadv ordained can receive continuing education. Classes began in August under provisional а certification, with a class of twelve. Full accreditation was received in September. Classes meet at the District Office and the cost is minimal. Paul Bozman taught the first course: History, Beliefs, and Practices of the Church of the Brethren and Tina Hunt (Pastor, Ashland First) is currently teaching the second: Teaching and Learning in the Church. The next class begins January 13th with Tom **Zuercher** (Pastor, Ashland Dickey) teaching "Introduction to Pastoral You don't have to be Care." clergy - anyone interested can sign up for individual classes. The Congregational Commission of the District Board provides a means of looking at project proposals of the churches of the Northern Ohio District Church of the Brethren to provide opportunities for new growth or service beyond already established membership. At the Fall District Board Meeting, the Congregational Commission studied two Hottle Grant applications from Brook Park Community CoB and Elm Street CoB. Both proposals provide wonderful opportunities for outreach in their communities.

Brook Park Community CoB has been instrumental in the inception and continued operation of Audrey's Outreach, a program that seeks to assist any person in need through outreach efforts including a Food Pantry operating every Monday and Thursday; Free Community Meals; Free Hot Lunches; Free Clothing Giveaways; Free Summer Lunch Sack Program for school kids; and a Free Community Garden. They needed a replacement concrete driveway to provide access for the delivery of items for their free dinners and food giveaways. This Hottle Grant will help Brook Park Community CoB continue to provide and serve the more than 500 families or 200 people per month.

Elm Street CoB requested funds for The Wheelhouse, a missional service that intends to provide bicycles and build relationships with those in need. Used bicycles are donated through Church bike drives, organizations and individuals. The Wheelhouse is a build-a-bike ministry where volunteers work with those in need to repair a donated bicycle. Volunteers work with youth and those in financial need to repair and learn how to fix and maintain bicycles. Elm Street needed garage space for volunteers to help bike recipients fix the bikes in a shop. Volunteers are providing up to 6 bicycles per week.

Both of these proposals provided great potential for creating and establishing service beyond our membership and the walls of each church. After prayerful consideration, both proposals were recommended to the District Board for approval. The District Board approved the recommendation of the Congregational Commission.

All churches in the Northern Ohio District are encouraged to bring outreach and service proposals for consideration.

Our application was approved and by the middle of May we had a brand new vinyl playground. Since then, the playground has proved to be a wonderful addition to our church and has been used for Vacation Bible School, our children's program, church picnics and cookouts. It has been enjoyed by families from our church and kids within the community.



This has also been a chance to show the children

within our church that they matter to us. We are not just concerned with maintaining the church building, paying bills, or "adult" things, but with things that matter to our kids and families. The new playground has provided some great times of fellowship, something new for families we invite to events, and has resulted in me being frequently asked, "Pastor Jason, can you give me an underdog?"

**Hartville** — Thank you, Hottle Memorial Fund Grant Committee for presenting the Hartville Church of the Brethren with a check for \$5,000.00 to assist our church and daycare center in purchasing a new van/bus. As I stated in our application, the new vehicle was necessary to stay in compliance with the State of Ohio in transporting our Loving Heart Christian Childcare children. The 2007 Starcraft Starlite 14 passenger bus meets all of the compliance points so that we can now transport the daycare children to various field trips and activities.



As was stated in our application, the cost of the vehicle was \$17,000.00. Including the \$5,000.00 figure from the Hottle Fund, the church and daycare would provide \$2,000.00, and we sought donors from within the church for the remaining \$10,000.00. I am extremely happy to say that our congregation really stepped up to our challenge and we raised the \$10,000.00 quickly! We purchased the van, had it customized with our church name an daycare name (which was included in the price of the bus), and it has been used quite often over the last six weeks. We then purchased 300 ink pens with our Brethren logo and address, and purchased as many welcome

We have anywhere from 2 to 10 youth most Sundays that go downstairs after the "Children's Story."



With the new equipment, we have been able to set up a

larger viewing area with more room for the children and plan to use the area in a variety of ways for our older youth activities.

**Mount Pleasant** — The Mt. Pleasant Community Garden was a recipient of a \$5,000 Hottle grant. The funds were used to purchase an 18x20 steel storage building to house our garden equipment. Pastor Bruce Jacobsen, Sam Davis and Phil Myers prepared the building site and the building was put into place on July 10, 2017. For the past three years our tractor, 4' tiller, 5' finish mower, and a trailer sat outside. We also purchased an ATV pull-type seeder with the grant money. Now, this equipment, as well as our irrigation and trellising supplies can be stored safely inside the building.



The purpose of the community garden is to glorify God by utilizing our resources to grow community relationships as we work together to alleviate hunger. Since its inception in 2011, the garden has donated 83,000 lbs. of fresh fruits and vegetables to the Stark County Hunger Task Force and has welcomed over 75 community volunteers. Elm Street Church of the Brethren is part of the Lima downtown community and has long embraced the goal to impact the social and spiritual needs of the neighborhood. This mission has led to the formation of multiple ministry projects. The church partnered with Salem Mennonite Church in Elida in 2009 to provide a monthly community meal served at the Elm Street Church. In 2014 a formalized clothing ministry, God's Closet was initiated at the Elm Street Church. The partnership with Salem expanded in 2013 with a shared mission trip to Hindman, Kentucky to serve with SWAP (Sharing with Appalachian People). These projects established a relationship which ultimately led to conversations about The Wheelhouse – A Christian Bicycle Cooperative, a "build a bike" ministry to provide low cost transportation for adults in need.

The Elm Street Church location near downtown Lima and adjacent to the Lima bike path was an ideal location for The Wheelhouse. Recognizing the ministry possibilities, the leadership at Elm Street allowed the transformation of Sunday school classroom space into the bicycle shop beginning in the fall of 2016 and opening for operation early in 2017.

Bicycles are donated to The Wheelhouse through church bike drives and from members of the community. Adults in need are referred by social agencies or church mission outreach programs through a common application form. Clients are then scheduled to come to The Wheelhouse during one of three weekly bike repair sessions. The Wheelhouse volunteers work alongside the new cyclist to refurbish the bicycle. During this work time, volunteers initiate a relationship with the cyclist and, if possible, open a faith conversation. At the close of each repair session, a prayer is offered for the new cyclist. Clients not affiliated with a church are invited to attend the Elm Street Church of the Brethren or an affiliated church close to their residence. Each week, Pastor Doug Price provides a follow-up contact with the cyclists to encourage a church commitment.

The initial target for The Wheelhouse was to rehab 35 to 100 bikes during 2017 year. Capacity for the bike shop increased as 2 volunteers with over 20 years of experience with bike repair joined other Wheelhouse volunteers. As of this date, an average of 5 to 6 bikes are being repaired each week with over 125 adult bikes completed between February and October of this year. Additionally, 50 youth bikes have been donated to service agencies. Fifteen area churches have committed to be part of 'The Wheel of Churches' to provide support for *The Wheelhouse* operations. This support includes the occasional bike drive and funding through Pedal Partners who sponsor a bike, lock and helmet at a cost of \$30.

This rapid growth has stretched the capacity of the new mission. Currently the 14-person Steering Committee and the 15-volunteer mechanics are in the process of building a storage facility behind the Elm Street church to stabilize the ministry. Funds for this building project have been generously donated through the Northern Ohio District Church of the Brethren Hottle Memorial Fund, Ohio Conference Mennonite Church Ministry Development Fund, Everence Financial, and other individual contributors. Plans are for this storage facility to decrease bike storage transport, increase volunteer leadership capacity and involve more community members from the adjacent bike/pedestrian path with The Wheelhouse ministry.

Elm Street Church of the Brethren is thankful to be part of an urban center and grateful for opportunities to serve the community. As a congregation, we are committed to meeting the physical and spiritual needs of our neighbors, thus continuing the work of Jesus. Peacefully. Simply. Together.
