COURSE OBJECTIVES

By the end of this unit, the student will:

A. Be able to identify each of the books of the NT in terms of their literary genre, origin in the life of the early church & basic issues or themes.

B. Be able to describe the formation of the NT canon & its authority for the church's faith & life.

C. Be able to identify some of the basic features of Jesus' ministry & message & compare the different portraits of Jesus in the 4 gospels.

D. Be able to place at least 24 key figures & events on a timeline of the era of the Christian origins.

E. Be able to take a selected text from the NT & demonstrate its use as a resource for a particular area of ministry.

This class is available to those interested in the ministry and to licensed ministers moving towards ordination. Ordained and Commissioned clergy can also take this class for CEU's (1.5 CEU's for attendance at all three Friday sessions) at a cost of \$25.00. Giving Through your IRA

Giving through your IRA is a great way to give and can be a great tax benefit to you, the donor. Those that are 70 ½ or older are eligible to give through an IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD).

A QCD allows you to donate through your IRA while not being taxed on the income withdrawn. The Northern Ohio District Church of the Brethren (NOHCOB) is qualified to receive Qualified Charitable Distributions. QCD from your IRA account are non-taxable.

Those that are 72 and older and are required to take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from their IRA can designate funds from that RMD as a QCD to NOHCOB.

To initiate a QCD gift, contact your IRA custodian and inform them that you would like to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA account to NOHCOB. Your custodian will be able to guide you through the process.

You will need to provide your custodian with our name and address.

Please ask your custodian to show on the distribution check or check stub:

- that your gift is from an IRA account
- the IRA account owner's name

Tod Bolsinger, MDiv, PhD, the coowner and principal of Sloan Leadership, Inc, an executive coaching and consulting firm that works with church, non-profit, and marketplace leaders in leading change.

He is also the Executive Director of the De Pree Center Church Leadership Institute a Senior Fellow of the De Pree Center for Leadership, and Associate Professor of Leadership Formation at Fuller Theological Seminary, was the founder of the Fuller Leadership Platform, an innovative approach to online formation and leadership development, and served as a Vice President of Fuller Seminary for six years.

Prior to his educational career, he served as a pastor for 27 years. Tod is the author of five books, including the Outreach Magazine Resource of the Year in pastoral leadership, Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory, the Christian Book Award Finalist, Tempered Resilience: How Leaders are Formed in the Crucible of Change, and The Practicing Change Series.


